

PRAYER OF THE DAY


The Lord be with you.

"Come, Light of Hope"




Candlelighters (two readers)

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

FIRST READING: Isaiah 2:1-5

The visionary message presented in this reading focuses on a future day when God establishes a universal reign of peace. Divine decisions will make war obsolete, and the worshiping community responds: "Let us walk in the light of that Lord now!"

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

In days to come

the mountain of the Lord's house

broken into


Two: Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.






